

Course related to cross cutting issues

Institution integrates crosscutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability into the Curriculum

The college conduct courses that integrate crosscutting issues as part of the curriculum prescribed by university.

The curriculum has incorporated Human Values and Professional Ethics aspects through courses such as **Human Values & Professional Ethics (HVPE-101)**. This course encourages students to discover what they consider valuable. Accordingly, they should be able to discriminate between valuable and the superficial in real situations in their life. The course also emphasizes the awareness related to the critical ability to distinguish between essence and form, in life - this ability is to be developed not for a narrow area or field of study, but for everyday situations in life, covering the widest possible canvas.

The university curriculum has also incorporated environmental and sustainability issues through courses such as **Environmental Science (EVSE 101)**, which is the part of curriculum of each programme. The course covers the local, regional and global environmental problems related to use and over-exploitation of resources. It also describes the threats to global biodiversity, their implications and potential solutions from unsustainable to sustainable development.

To sensitize the holistic development of students, the Institute offers the course related to Humanities & Social Sciences i.e. Foundation Course in **Humanities (Development of Societies/Philosophy) (HSMC 101-18)**. This subject provides the evaluation from a holistic perspective along with the thorough understanding of social, political, economic chronology or development in human being and society. This develops strong natural familiarity humanities along with right understanding enabling them to eliminate conflict and strife in the individual and society.

Mandatory courses that include **Constitution of India (BTMC 101-18)** and **Essence of Indian Traditional Knowledge (BTMC 102-18)** provide the contents associated to constitution law and constitutionalism under the Scheme of the Fundamental Right to Equality (Gender discrimination). The course also provides the salient features, fundamental rights, fundamental duties and legal status of the Constitution of India.

The university offers the **Mentoring and Professional Development courses** for students in various semesters. The mentoring course is divided in two sections i.e. outdoor activities and class activities. The class activities contain general awareness on cross-cutting issues and current affairs via seminars tutorials and workshops, whereas, outdoor activities include various camps and drives which are associated with different clubs of the college i.e. NSS, NCC, Fine arts club, ISTE student chapter, theatre club, sports and cultural activities etc.
